

## **June 03, 2022 - NYCRGC, Board Of Directors Meeting**

Meeting called to order - 6:40 PM

Attendees - Bruce Ballard, Todd Corriveau, Jared Harvey, Bruce Hill, Ray Hill

### Old Business:

There were two club events held during May:

1. Spring Cleanup of the Club grounds - our annual spring cleanup was held on Saturday, May 7, from 9 - 11 am. There were approximately 12 volunteers who showed up to help out, and because of all the help and support, we were able to finish the work in about 2 hours. We got a lot accomplished, including raking up yard debris, hauling and piling up brush and trees branches, and putting up a new club sign at the front gate. We appreciate everyone who came out to support the club and help out. Volunteer names and hours worked were recorded, and will count towards membership discounts for next year.
2. An Introduction to Fishing class was held at the Club on Saturday, May, 21, 2022. There were 7 people who attended the class. The class was conducted by Tom Cafferky. The course included different types of rods and reels, different types of knots and how to tie them, best type of fishing line to use, different lures and how and where to use them, safe fish handling for both angler and the fish, best fishing times, safety and casting techniques. Practice casting was also held outside at the Club's retaining pond. Attendees received fish identification cards, booklets on fishing rules, fish Maine stickers and one of Tom's favorite Fishing lures. There was also a raffle for fishing poles and reels, and all of the kids received a prize.
3. The money raffle tickets have been printed and are now available to sell; so the Club's annual fund raising raffle is officially underway. As we had last year, the prizes are \$1000, \$500, \$250, \$100, \$50, and the winners will be drawn at our Christmas Party in December. We need help with selling tickets. 4. In conjunction with the cash raffle, we still intend to also have a gun raffle prize which will be drawn at the Club Pig Roast in September. Because of the two different drawing dates, we will have separate tickets for the cash and the handgun prizes. The Club needs contact the local dealer (Humphrey's) to work out the details, decide on a firearm to raffle, establish ticket costs, and get tickets printed.
5. Work on improving the Long Range will commence as soon as the contractor (Dan Winn) is finished with his logging for the season, estimated for late June.

### New Business:

1. The Club's two main raffle ticket selling events are coming up. These are the Ossipee Valley Fair, (July 7,8,9 &10); and the Acton Fair (August 25, 26, 27 & 28). We will need people to help man the ticket tables, so please keep the dates in mind and volunteer to help out if you can.
2. We are moving forward with a granite, block style, memorial bench for Lou. This should be ordered in the near future, and the club will work out the details of getting the stone delivered and set in place.
3. The Club Auction is scheduled for Saturday, July 16. Volunteers are needed to help with this event. The Club is still accepting donations. If anyone has items in good condition that will sell, please contact Romeo Fortin.
4. Work on the concrete pad for grilling and the memorial bench should be underway shortly. Wood for constructing a form, and wire for the pad are on site at the club, and we are planning to get a bulk delivery of mixed concrete from a local vendor, so we are hopeful this project won't take too long.

5. Club member, Bruce Hill, has begun work on laying out an archery range to the left of the retaining pond, adjacent to the long range. If anyone is interested in archery shooting and would like assist with getting a range up and running, please contact Bruce Hill.
